Their comments are included.
















History and Nature Together at Ouro Preto, Brazil, Beatriz Fernandes Pina

• The shapes of the boat sails make this a very interesting image. Contrasted wonderfully by the stone mountains in the background. From where this image was taken – the sea?


Northern Lights Dancing, Canada, Christen McDonald

This image of running water is magical. The image draws you in and makes you want to explore.


Sweet Treats, Hungary, Schwahofer Zsofia


This pictures shows Kenya in a way you have never seen it before. Very interesting and makes you want to explore.

On the Sukhona River near Opoki in the Vologda Region, Russia, Daria Glebova




A beautiful image showing details wonderfully. The rock face contrasts with the soft looking curve of the trees.
